“When life handed Collins lemons in 2003 via the telecom bust and the Enron scandal that helped to tank the economy and threatened her business, she made the proverbial lemonade. Collins founded CareerLink in 2000 with just \$40,000 in startup capital. She established offices in Dallas and Houston and grew the business to more than \$1.5 million in revenue in less than a year. In 2003, when the economy was bleak and her company suffered along with many others, she didn't fold up her tent and crawl away- she expanded. She launched HealthLinkRx, a recruiting company specializing in the health care industry, and ConsortioSolutions, the consulting arm of CareerLink created to service publicly traded clients' Sarbanes Oxley compliance needs. Five years later, CareerLink is generating \$7 million in revenue annually. Community Involvement: CareerLink was a sponsor of the Children's Cancer Fund's 2005 Beyond the Rainbow luncheon and fashion show; a sponsor for Attitudes and Attire's luncheon and fashion show; supports Genesis Women's Shelter, which provides safety and shelter to battered women and their children; and works with Samaritan International.”
